What Happens Next



You have the right to a forensic medical exam, at no out-ofpocket cost to you. If you are over the age of 18, you are not required to report the crime to the police. You have the option to report to law enforcement and you can make that decision when you are ready.



The Hospital SANE programs will hold your Sexual Assault Kit (SAK) for 6 months and allow you time to decide. If you decide that

you do not want to report your assault to the police, the hospital will automatically destroy your SAK after 6 months.



If you reported the crime to the police, call the law enforcement agency if you have questions about your case. The police will collect your SAK from the hospital. Make sure your contact information is up -to-date so the investigator can reach you.
