## **Statement of Purpose & Goals**

The Women of Color Task Force has been continuously involved in addressing issues relevant to domestic violence (DV) against women since its founding in November 1999. Several original and early members remain actively involved. Outreach to the faith-based community has been a significant part of our work due to its significance for many women of color seeking DV help and guidance.

In recognition of the isolation, frustration, anger, lack of representation, and invisibility felt by women of color in the DV movement, we pledge to work toward the following goals:

- To educate through training, prevention, and availability of resources.
- To advocate by removing barriers and connecting with national organizations.
- · To empower through education.
- To network through outreach and making contacts with others who share our experience, philosophy, and goals.
- To be proactive by identifying opportunities for collaborative efforts.

## **Membership**

Membership in the Women of Color Task Force is free and open to all Delaware women whose self-identity and experiences are aligned with other women of color. While attempting to avoid complexities of race and ethnicity, confirmation of membership is the decision of designated members. Solidarity, affiliation, and/or familiarity with women of color is insufficient for membership; as well as marriage to, partnership with, or parenting of children of color. Women of color who have a sincere interest in issues of violence against women, as well as survivors of domestic violence are welcome to apply. No special work experience, education, training, skills, or talents are required.

DV IS OFTEN LETHAL! We have a lot of work to do. Did you know...?

- Black women are 3 times more likely to die because of DV than white women?
- DV is the #1 cause of cause of death for Black women between the ages of 15 and 35?
- While Black women make up only 8% of the general population, 22% of DV-related homicides impact them?

Because DV victims or survivors are diverse, our approach to addressing violence against women of color is necessarily diverse.

Can you identify other factors that might impact women of color domestic violence victims or survivors?

Increased vulnerability – Barriers to safety – Obstacles to leaving – Economic factors – Cultural and institutional impediments – Experiences with law enforcement & legal systems – Religious views & practices – Rearing/upbringing – Family relationships & supports – Connection to neighborhood & community – Perception of partnership, marriage & parenting – Level of comfort with engaging with service resources – Sense of values/right & wrong – Definition of strengths & weaknesses – Authenticity in interactions with others – Personal expectations – And the reasons why some women choose to stay in abusive or unhealthy relationships.
