Food and Pantry

In the wake of the State of Emergency, the Governor ordered all Delaware public schools to close until March 27, 2020. All children under the age of 18 are eligible to receive **school breakfast and lunch**. Visit <u>www.doe.k12.de.us/</u> <u>covid19</u> for a full list of "grab and go" school meal sites.

Additionally, DART is offering public school students free bus rides to "grab and go" school meal sites on regularly scheduled bus routes from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. until school is back in session. <u>Of course, please consider your health and personal circumstances before using public transportation.</u>

The **Food Bank of Delaware** directly distributes EMERGENCY food to the public through the Healthy Pantry Center. Appointments are required at the Newark and Milford pantry locations. For **Newark** appointments call (302) 292-1305 ext. 227 or for **Milford** appointments call (302) 424-3301 ext. 106. Participants must bring ID and proof of Delaware Residency.

Milford Pantry 1040 Mattlind Way, Milford, DE 19963. Enter building through entrance under green awning. Return visits are after 7 days or greater.

Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays: 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (last participant at 3:30 p.m.)

4th Tuesdays: 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. (last participant at 6:30 p.m.)

2nd Saturday: 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (last participant at 11:30 a.m.)

Courts

Starting Tuesday, March 17, 2020, the Justice of the Peace Courts stopped processing evictions, or scheduling eviction trials, until May 1, 2020. There are limited exceptions to this order, such as cases where there is an emergency requiring the case to move forward, and someone convinces the court that serious harm will occur if the case is delayed.

You may still get notices from your landlord, for example if you did not pay rent. If you get a notice from your landlord, please ask to be referred to the MLP by your advocate. We are still here to help, and offer advice.

Delaware Family Courts remain open, albeit on a limited basis for inperson matters. Please contact the court directly for additional details.

Utilities

Electric and Gas:

<u>Delmarva Power Company</u> has suspended all disconnections of service, and is waiving late fees. While they cannot disconnect services during the cold weather months, typically determined to end by April 15th, Delmarva has extended that period to May 1, 2020, due to COVID-19.

Delmarva is asking that customers with temporary or extended financial hardship contact them to discuss possible payment arrangements, and energy assistance options. <u>https://www.delmarva.com/safetyCommunity/Safety/Pages/coronavirus.aspx</u>

Wi-Fi/Internet Services:

If you are eligible for public assistance programs such as:

- the National School Lunch Program
- Housing Assistance
- Medicaid, SNAP
- SSI and other related programs

You could be eligible for Comcast's free 60 day Wi-Fi/internet plan.

Comcast has announced a plan to make home internet more accessible to low-income communities in the wake of COVID-19. Individuals must complete an application by April 30, 2020, and if approved, may receive 60 days of free internet service, with plans starting at \$9.95 per month thereafter. State Assistance Programs

The Delaware Division of Medicaid and Medical Assistance is coordinating with federal and local partners to respond to COVID–19 as information becomes available. The latest Delaware specific information can be found at https://www.dhss/delaware.gov/dhss/dph/epi/2019novelcoronavirus.html.

Medicaid:

Effective March 19, 2020, the Delaware Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS) has announced that all Medicaid renewals/recertification will be suspended and automatically renewed to avoid lapses in coverage.

Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) Premiums:

Effective March 19, 2020, DHSS announced that all premiums for the CHIP program are waived to expand access to coverage for children in families who are otherwise eligible for the CHIP program.

Public Benefits:

If you lost your job or hours due to COVID-19, you can apply for Medicaid/ Medical Assistance, SNAP (food stamps), TANF cash assistance, or LIHEAP heating assistance. If you already receive any/all of these benefits, you may be able to get an increase in benefits due to your reduced income. To apply for benefits, go to: <u>https://assist.dhss.delaware.gov/</u>

Public Charge:

During the COVID-19 outbreak, non-Citizens who need testing, and treatment related to the COVID-19 outbreak <u>will not</u> be considered a public charge by Immigration. If you have questions related to the public charge rule please ask your advocate to refer you to the MLP for additional information.

Unemployment:

If you or someone in your household is not working due to:

- Shut downs because of the State of Emergency declaration; or
- Being ordered by a doctor to self quarantine; or
- Being forced to quit or take unpaid leave from your job to care for children due to the Governor's emergency closure of schools
